Speaker/Program

Mr. Roger B. Tate, P.E. will present a program of "Case Studies in Engineering Ethics."

This class is acceptable for continuing ethics education credit for professional registration in all states except Florida.

Mr. Tate is a forensic engineer who specializes in fire protection and mechanical engineering issues. He investigates and analyzes failures and malfunctions of fire suppression systems, machinery, combustion equipment, and piping. He has over fourteen years active experience as a forensic engineer and has recently joined Verité Forensic Engineering, LLC. Mr. Tate holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Engineering degrees in Mechanical Engineering, and completed two years of engineering graduate school beyond the Masters level. Prior to becoming a forensic engineer, Mr. Tate worked in the aircraft manufacturing and satellite communications industries. Mr. Tate has testified at trial in multiple civil cases and one criminal case. He holds Professional Engineer licenses in 28 states and has passed the national licensing examinations in both Mechanical and Fire Protection Engineering. He is the current President of the Dallas-Fort Worth Chapter of the Society of Fire Protection Engineers and was presented with the 2007 Hat's Off Award for service to the Society in developing licensing examinations. In addition to his professional life, Mr. Tate is a Deacon in his church and an active adult leader in the Boy Scouts of America.
